**PERSONAL WORD**

Now is the time. With most of Trinity's pastoral staff away on a trip to the Holy Land, I feel like we should start something new. (Ha!) I haven't been here very long, so you don't have much of a reason to trust me, but I have a scripture to encourage us in our uncertainty. In Matthew 25 there is a judgment scene where the King separates all the nations into the sheep to his right and the goats to his left. Sheep go on up to the joy of their master and the goats apparently go to munch on kudzu for eternity. The difference? Simply doing (or not doing) these tasks found in verses 35-36: "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." The needs are so simple we wonder why they can't be addressed: hunger, thirst, isolation, exposure, sickness, imprisonment.

In West Homewood I know some people who are excited. They aren't just excited about new paint or road signs or coffee. These folks are excited that what God is doing in West Homewood will enable us to do the tasks called for in Matthew 25. The church is at its best when it is meeting the needs of the communities Jesus planted us in. Here is the beginning of something new, and a few important dates for you to make note:

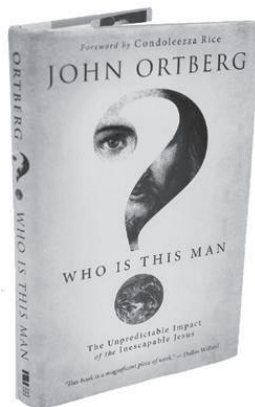

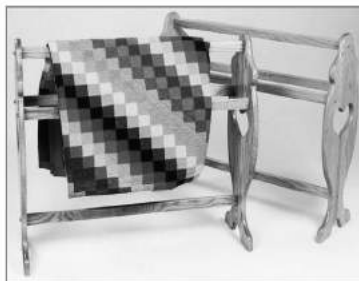
