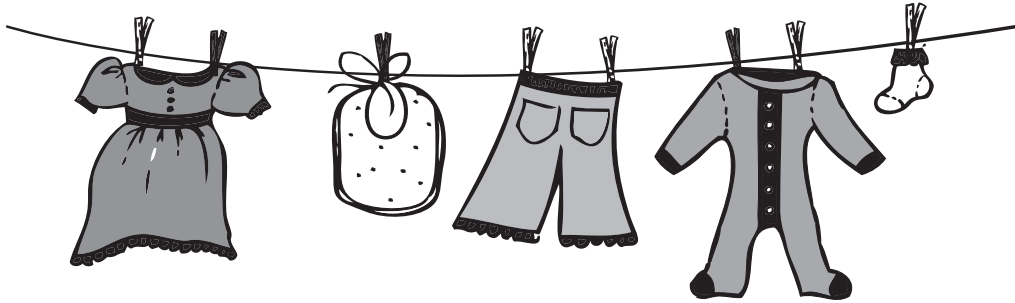

PERSONAL WORD

The practice of anointing—of rubbing oil on the forehead of those who are suffering—is an ancient practice, signifying for Christians that the Holy Spirit is with them. The Hebrew word Messiah, and the Greek word “Christos” or “Christ,” literally mean “The Anointed One.” When we call Jesus the Christ we are saying that we believe God is with him, that he is set apart by God for a specific purpose. And when we anoint each other, whether we are suffering through illness, broken relationships, or broken faith, we reclaim the promise that God is indeed with us.

The first time I ever witnessed an anointing I was helping a Catholic priest tend to a parishioner just before surgery. The gentleman had requested that the Father come and anoint him prior to what was going to be a dangerous procedure.

As that old priest gave thanks to God for the gift of life, he turned to the patient and asked him if there were things that needed to be made right in his life. If there was anything that was keeping him from God, any sin that needed to be confessed, any broken relationship that needed to be healed. As a good Protestant, I figured it was a rhetorical question, but sure enough, there in that hospital room, this man lifted up his many failings.

He confessed his fear of dying, he wept as he apologized to his wife for the wrongs he had committed in their marriage. It was one of the most intimate and holy moments I have ever witnessed. And then that old priest looked right in the man’s eyes and said, “Brother, in the name of Jesus Christ, and in the eyes of God, you are forgiven.” And I believed him.

The priest dabbed his finger in the jar of oil, and anointed the gentleman’s forehead, praying for health and wholeness—not just for that believer’s body, but for his entire being—his heart, his spirit, his soul and his relationships. For God to be with him.

On September 11, 2001, one of the Chaplains for the Fire Department, made the sign of the cross with anointing oil on the foreheads of those brave men and women before they rushed in to the burning buildings. Survivors later reported in disbelief that as the firefighters ran past them, right into the middle of the blaze, their foreheads, covered in soot and smoke, seemed to shine with the cross. God was with them.

This weekend, as we continue our Lenten sermon series, “Who Is This Man?,” we will close our services with a time of anointing and prayer, as we remember that Jesus was and is a healer. If you or someone you love is struggling with a sickness of body, mind, or soul, I hope you will come and share in this powerful time of worship and hope.

Because we all need to be reminded, especially when the soot and smoke make it difficult to see, that He is with us.

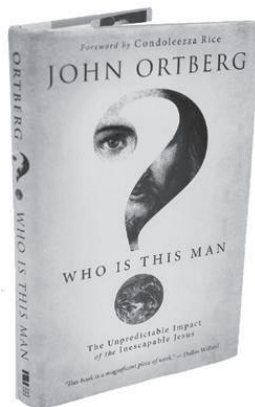

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE

Deadline to apply: March 13, 2016

Trinity's Committee on Higher Education & Campus Ministry is accepting applications for the following scholarships:

- The Edith Bowles Huffstutler Scholarship is awarded to students who are members of Trinity UMC and are enrolled at Birmingham-Southern College or Samford University. Selection of the recipients is based upon financial need, academic achievement, community involvement, and church participation.
- The Mabel W. McFee Scholarship is awarded to students who are children or grandchildren of clergy members of the North Alabama Conference of the UMC. Applicants need not be members of Trinity UMC. Applicants must be enrolled at any four-year college or university. Recipients are selected on the basis of financial need, academic achievement, community involvement, and church participation.
- United Methodist Church / College Partnership Scholarship Program Students who have been accepted to Birmingham-Southern College may apply. Trinity UMC nominates a student by pledging a scholarship amount per year for four years and Birmingham-Southern College provides a 2-to-1 match per year for four years, provided the nominee is selected to receive the award. (Download form: <http://www.bsc.edu/fp/umc-forms/umccp.pdf>)
- The Hagood/Young Scholarship is awarded to a student who is a member of Trinity UMC and plans to enroll in Birmingham-Southern College. See church office for more details.

The requirements and applications for scholarships may be picked up at the church office. Amounts to be awarded from the Huffstutler and McFee Scholarships may vary according to the yearly earnings of the trust funds. The applications must be returned to the church office no later than March 13, 2016 – this date is strictly enforced.

The recipients of the Huffstutler and McFee Scholarships and the nomination for the United Methodist Church and College Partnership Scholarship Program will be chosen by the Committee on Higher Education and Campus Ministries and be approved by the Board of Trustees. Recipients will be notified by a formal letter.
