A PERSONAL WORD

Over the years, Trinity has had a part in several new church start-ups. The three that I know about have become significant, growing churches – Riverchase, Discovery and most recently, Liberty Park. We now have the privilege of being a vital part of another new church start up led by our own Dr. Dave Barnhart.

A couple of years ago, Dave came back from a trip to Korea, where he had gone on a continuing educational event, to experience the rapid growth of churches in that nation. He came back excited by what he found – churches that were not only thriving (30,000 + in attendance), but were also planting new churches around the world. He was convinced from that trip that healthy churches need to reproduce. I had never seen him as passionate about something.

He began to explore, with us, the possibility of Trinity being an important part of planting a new church. We networked with our District and Conference, and Canterbury UMC – and together we will help to launch a new church under Dave’s leadership.

The question of “where will it be?” is not the first question being asked. Rather the question is “who will it be?” The fastest growing group among religious affiliation these days are called the “nones.” These are young adults who when asked their religious preference reply with “none.”

In the 1960s the “nones” comprised 5-7% of the population; by the mid-90s they had grown to 12%; in 2011 the percentage was 19%. According to the invaluable data on religion ongoingly posted by the Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life, the incidence of “nones” is highest in the age group of 30-49. Today 33% of young people are religiously unaffiliated, as compared with 12% in the 1970s.

The “nones” are not atheists – they simply don’t connect to religion or the church. Some have been hurt by bad religion. Others find the answers offered by religious bodies at odds with the answers they hear from other places.

Dave has a real passion and gift for connecting with these types of young adults and for building bridges to the gospel with them. He also has a vision and passion for helping young adults discover a life of radical discipleship. This is the “who.”

In June, Dave will leave our staff to begin the ground work for this new church. Several Trinity members will be a part of the nucleus. Trinity will be providing financial, along with other types of support. We will commission this “team” on July 3.

I don’t have to tell you what a valuable member of our staff Dave has been. He is one of the brightest and most capable pastors I know, as well as among the wisest. We are proud of him and proud to be a part of what God will do through him, Angela and Leo.

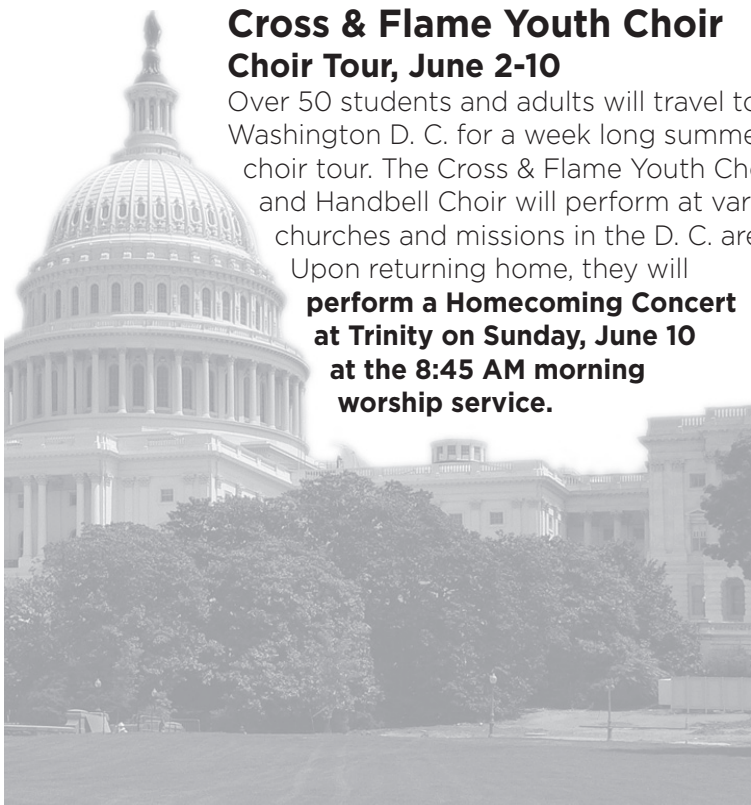
